eBooks & eAudios on Boundless and Hoopla!





BCLS has eBooks and eAudiobooks available on two platforms: Boundless and Hoopla free-ofcharge.

What is the difference? Boundless is a platform hosted by Baker & Taylor with titles selected and purchased by BCLS that are made available for check out to BCLS patrons. Hoopla is a streaming subscription service with materials that are curated by Hoopla that BCLS subscribes to and makes available to BCLS patrons. Another difference is that Boundless has only eBooks and eAudiobooks, while Hoopla also offers comics, movies, TV shows,

magazines, and music.

Each platform has an app that must be downloaded to a mobile device, laptops, tablets, and PCs. Just go to your app store to download the free "Boundless" or "Hoopla" app for your device.

Next, for Boundless search for "Bolivar County Library System" for location, then enter your barcode and PIN. On Hoopla you must search of Bolivar County Library System" and then follow instructions to create an account. With both apps, once to you login the first time, as long as you don't logout, you will not have to reenter credentials again.

Please be aware that to comply with Mississippi Code, §39-3-25, materials on Boundless and Hoopla are only available for checkout to adults 18-years and older. However, both Boundless and Hoopla allow adults to add children and teen profiles to their personal accounts to allow children and teens access to age-appropriate materials.



Looking For a Good Book?

Hadiya: Quiet Beautiful Things by Samantha Christy. You will love this book as you get entangled in the lives of the characters. You will learn so much about being deaf and hearing impaired. It is heartwarming to read about the advances made for children and the determination to learn ASL. This book brings to life what is real. The characters are amazing, strong, and brave willing to fight for their place in the world. This is sadness, pain, betrayal, humor, and beautiful and passionate relationship between father and daughter; but also, between Blake and Dr. Ellie. A page turner that will keep you involved until the last written line. Quiet Beautiful Things is a beautiful story—I give it two thumbs up!! (Fiction—Print)

Tamara: Extinction by Douglas Preston. This is a fast-paced, entertaining novel that author James Rollins described as "Jurassic *Park* for the Pleistocene era." Erebus Resort is the newest wildlife park with formerly extinct species (wooly mammoths, Irish elk, giant sloths, etc.) in a natural

setting in Colorado. Things go bad with the kidnapping of a billionaire's son and daughter-in-law—but it's just the beginning... If you like *Jurassic Park*, you'll love this. I couldn't put it down! (Fiction—Print & eBook)

Cindy: The Keeper of Stars by Buck Turner. I loved this book! It's a very sweet story of young love and I could not put it down! It's 1962... Jack is a small-town boy from Tennessee, whose life revolves around taking care of his mother and running a small tourist fishing company with his old friend. He loves the outdoors, and the local lakes are what he enjoys most in life. Until Ellie shows up to spend the summer with her aunt! Ellie is a city girl who is getting ready to go to college in the fall. Her plans are to become an astronomer. They meet, fall in love and begin making plans for the future, until forces beyond their control pull them away and their lives take different paths. Twelve years later a death in the family brings them back together. Will they be able to sort out the

unfortunate events that tore them apart that fateful summer under the stars? (Fiction—Print)

Tamara: A Daughter of Fair Verona by Christina Dodd. Have you ever wondered what would have happened if Romeo & Juliet had not died? Dodd gives us her version of what may have transpired if the star-crossed lovers had survived to become respected members of the Montague clan and had children. Romeo & Juliet's daughter Rosie is the oldest of seven and has cleverly avoided marriage. That is, until she is unhappily betrothed to Duke Stephano, who has already buried three unlucky wives. To compound an already unfortunate situation, Rosie falls in love at her betrothal ball-just not to her betrothed! When a murder victim is found. Rosie finds herself suspect number one. Rosie must hurry to find the killer-before she is next. The first book in Dodd's new series, the novel is a delightfully irreverent-and funny -mystery. (Fiction-Print & eBook)

Some Bolivar County History...

"Rosedale by Florence Sillers Ogden" - Continued

The last excerpt started the "Early Merchants" section, ending with the sentence, "Theirs was the oldest business institution in the town under its original management."

"In the early days of the Misses Obersts' spring opening was the most talked of event of the year for the ladies. On opening day, long before the appointed hour, the more ambitious of the sex would gather before the closed doors of the establishment to await the moment they would swing open, that they might have the first choice of lovely spring hats. The spring opening has passed into history along with the Merry Widow hats and the hobble skirts, for now the ladies buy their spring hats in January and discard them in June, but Miss Rosa and Miss Mollie served a very pressing need in their day.

The Lewis Myers dry goods store is the second oldest mercantile establishment. Mr. Myers came to Rosedale in 1903 and built the store, which he operates today. A. R. Shattuck owned and operated for many years a dry goods store on the present site of Jackson Brothers' Hardware store.

Mr. H. D. Chaney, proprietor of Chaney's Drug Store until his death in 1916, was one of the town's most beloved citizens. He came in the early nineties and won the hearts of the children by having "Free Soda Water Day" when he opened his fountain each spring. He dispensed the first Coca-Cola ever to be drunk in the town, about 1903. His store was the gathering place for the young people, and his Christmas gifts and toys were a feature for many years. L. C. Brown opened a Drug Store about 1914 and was a popular figure until his death in 1930.

A. Lapresto had a grocery store on the present site of the office of the *Bolivar County Democrat* [newspaper]. He later operated a restaurant and was noted for his fine oyster loaves. He was the town's first Italian-American citizen. His descendants live here today.

There have been two or more Chinese merchants in the town as far back as anyone can remember. Some merchants today: J. E. Dattel, Sam Bachman, I. Mostkoff, Michael Bros., W. E. Smith, Jackson Bros., Priestly Gift Shop. F. D. Lewis is the present pharmacist."
