The Robinson-Carpenter Memorial Library in Cleveland has recently become home to a permanent art installation! The City of Cleveland Beautification Commission works diligently to keep the Cleveland area attractive and welcoming. Art installations are typically found at Delta State University and Downtown Cleveland.

"Haiku Man" was sculpted by Glenn Zweygardt of Alfred Station, New York. The piece was the competition winner in the Competition Class II 2002-2004, and was a 2004 Purchase Award. The piece was originally installed near the then Zeigel Music Center (now Zeigel Hall) on the Quad at Delta State University.

The sculpture was installed at the library on November 20, 2024, on the front lawn (facing Court Street). We are honored to be "home" of this wonderful piece. Don't forget to stop by the Robinson-Carpenter Memorial Library to enjoy this amazing artwork!

Thank you to the City of Cleveland Beautification Commission for including our library in your vision!"



Some Bolivar County History...

"Rosedale by Florence Sillers Ogden" - Continued

The last excerpt started the "Levee Inspection," ending with the last sentence: They have four grandchildren, Ed Green, Jr., and Margaret Green, Charles B. III, and Dorothy Ruth Allen."

"Banks

The first bank in Bolivar County was the Bank of Rosedale, founded in 1888, by Charles Scott, who was its president. This bank failed in 1898, was reorganized and the depositors paid in full. Mr. Scott continued as president for a number of years. After surviving boll weevil, panics, and other disasters, it finally closed its doors in 1922, during the deflation which followed World War I.

The Valley Bank, now the oldest bank in the county, was established in November 1898. The original stockholders were W. B. Roberts, Dave Reinach, J. L. Wilson, Godfrey Frank, and a number of employees in Frank's Memphis office, including James G. McGehee. For many years W. B. Roberts served as president, and J. L. Wilson as cashier. The bank has grown in its forty-seven years and is now about ten times as large as in the first years of operation. Several accounts on the books have run continuously for forty-seven years. The institution has aided in financing many enterprises in this section, totalling [sic] millions of dollars. The present officers are J. L. Wilson, president; W. C. Roberts, vice-president; J. L. Wilson, Jr., cashier; and J. E. Bobo, assistant cashier. The directors are J. L. Wilson, J. L. Wilson Jr., Walter Sillers, H. H. McGowen, and Cal Busby. Sillers and Roberts are attorneys.

The Bolivar County Bank operated for a short period, 1920 to 1930, when it failed under the impact of the depression."
