Reference Services Librarian Tamara Blackwell has been with the library system since 2006 when she started as a Branch Librarian at the Shelby library and then moved to her current position of Reference Services Librarian at the Robinson-Carpenter Memorial Library the next year.

Tamara exhibited an early interest in libraries, getting her first library card at age 5 and being a member

of the Library Club while in high school. After graduation she joined the U.S. Army and was stationed at Fort Riley, KS—Home of the Big Red One! Following her honorable discharge, she followed her husband during the last 10 years of his Army service with two tours in then West Germany interspersed with a year at Fort Lewis, WA, and ending with Fort McClellan, AL. Tamara worked as a civilian at Fort McClellan for 10 years until its closure in 1999 afforded her the

opportunity to attend college full-time. She earned her B.A. in History at Jacksonville State University and her Master of Library & Information Studies at the University of Alabama.

"I've always loved libraries," Tamara confided, "but it wasn't until I worked at a military library while in Germany that I realized I would love to be a professional librarian. That dream finally came true 16 years later."

"RIVERTON

By Florence W. Sillers

In 1870, there was a thriving little town at the Riverton landing on the Mississippi River about six miles north of Beulah, then the county seat.

Mr. B. J. Martin built a railroad from Bogue Phalia to Riverton. This line of road was the first railroad in Bolivar County and was operated by mule power. Mr. Martin had a law office in Riverton, besides his station and warehouse for his railroad. Mr. E. H. Moore, afterwards one of the county's most prominent lawyers and citizens, opened a law office at Riverton.

Major D. C. Herndon, Mr. John Young, D. Reinach, and later, Colonel F. A. Montgomery, built homes in Riverton, and there were other residences there. The merchants were Frank Williams, J. D. McDonald, E. H. Moore, David Reinach, and several others.

The caving banks of the Mississippi River have entirely destroyed the village of Riverton; and where once stood that prosperous and important little town is now the center of the great river. Not a vestige remains to show that Riverton ever existed; it is only a memory to a few old citizens. The town of Prentiss was left outside the levee and abandoned, but the land upon which it was built remains. Not so with Riverton—the river devoured it completely."
