### **Director's Corner**

Our libraries often receive requests for materials, and we always strive to fulfill those requests. Requests are helpful because they give us insights into what our patrons want to read and allow us to be proactive in purchasing materials (emerging authors, genres, series, etc.) that may be interesting to all patrons. While we cannot guaranty each request will be filled, we will always try our best.

When you are in the library, ask for request cards to take home! Who knows when you will run across a title/item you are interested in! You can return those

requests to the library in person or even mail them back to us.

Most of the requests we receive are for physical books, but do not forget libraries are more than just hardbacks. Feel free to request DVDs, audiobooks on CD, and electronic materials! Oftentimes, people don't want to request an item because they believe they are the only person who wants to enjoy a title. Remember, if you are interested in something, someone else probably is as well!

The area we receive the fewest requests for is electronic materials. I have noticed a trend in our electronic checkouts-50% of

those checkouts are for eBooks and 50% is for eAudiobooks. Once our libraries circulated many physical audiobooks on CD. Nowadays, many vehicles do not have CD players and purchasing content on an eReader is quick and easy in your own home. But don't forget BCLS has eAudiobooks available and patrons can request these types of items as well! We would love to curate a patron-focused electronic collection. If the idea of utilizing eAudiobooks for a car ride seems daunting, give us a call! It is super easy and a great way to enjoy your car ride!

# 3D Printer Demo at Robinson-Carpenter

BCLS is offering a 3D Printer **Demo** by Karla Bristlin for Teens ages 12 and up. The program is October 26th at 10 a.m. at the Robinson-Carpenter Memorial Library in Cleveland.

The demonstration is meant for teens and adults that have an interest in learning to use the 3D printer. After the demonstration, Patrons 12 and up may either request to use the 3D printer (inlibrary use only at Robinson-Carpenter) or request an item be created with the 3D printer on a

first come, first serve basis. All users must have a valid BLCS library card in good standing (owe no fees/fines and have no overdue materials).

Once a 3D object has begun printing, the user may leave the printer unattended, but must notify the Circulation Desk they are leaving and then return to pick-up the completed project within eight calendar days.

Patrons 12 and up may make a 3D Printer Request for library staff to fulfill. Requests must be accompa-

nied by a 3D design that has been uploaded from a digital computer file to a storage device, and also have up to eight calendar days to pick-up their project.

Remember to call to reserve the 3D printer. No "walkins" will be accepted and Saturday appointments are not available.

For complete rules and guidelines, see the 3D Printer Policy. The Policy and the 3D Printer Request Form may be obtained by asking at the Circulation Desk at any BCLS library.

# Looking for a Good Book?

Cindy: The Barn: The Secret History of a Murder in Mississippi by Wright Thompson. The author of Pappyland: A Story of Family, Fine Bourbon, and the Things That Last recounts the history of the torture and murder of a 14 yearold boy just visiting relatives in Mississippi from Chicago, It's a really hard read... A hard story to wrap my mind around. A story of Emmett Till. There are a lot of references to local people and places, past and present. Highly recommended. (Non-Fiction-Print)

Martha: Sniffing Out Murder (A Bailey the Bloodhound Mystery) by Kallie E. Benjamin, who also writes as V. M. Burns and Valerie Burns. In this first book of the series, we are introduced to Pris and her beloved bloodhound Bailey in Crosby, Indiana. Pris has just resigned as a teacher to pursue her writing career of children's books that feature Bailey, her bloodhound. An altercation with a

new school board member who is found dead—by Bailey, no less—has Pris wandering about her future, however, when she finds herself the prime suspect. I really enjoyed this cozy mystery and can't wait for the next book in the series! (Fiction—Print & eBook)

Tamara: Horror Movie by Paul Tremblay. Tremblay is the author of The Cabin at the End of the World, which was made into the movie Knock at the Cabin by M. Night Shyamalan—so you know it's going to be creepy and dreadinducing. In 1993, a small group made an art-house horror movie of which only three scenes have ever been publicly released. Driven by social media, the mystery surrounding the deaths of most of the filmmakers, and the belief that the movie is a "cursed film," the film has become a cult sensation. So much so that the only surviving cast member has been thrust into the limelight. Now a remake is in the works

with the only surviving cast member reprising his role... Wow, talk about eerie and unsettling. Highly recommended for horror fans. (Fiction—Print

Tamara: A Talent for Murder by Peter Swanson. This is the third in the Henry Kimball series, the first being A Kind Worth Killing, followed by A Kind Worth Saving. While technically a standalone, certain plot points revealed in the previous books would ruin the mystery of the first two, so I highly recommend reading them in order. In this installment, Lily Kintner is called by her old college friend Martha with a thorny problem—Martha suspects her husband of a series of crimes and does not know what to do about it. When Lily begins investigating, she finds that things don't look good for Martha's husband—but that's just the beginning! Twisty and devious, I highly recommend this excellent mystery/thriller. (Fiction—Print & Large Print)

## Some Bolivar County History...

### "Rosedale by Florence Sillers Ogden" - Continued

The last excerpt started the "Early Merchants" section, ending with the sentence, "Some merchants today: J. E. Dattel, Sam Bachman, I. Mostkoff, Michael Bros., W. E. Smith, Jackson Bros., Priestly Gift Shop. F. D. Lewis is the present pharmacist."

### "Levee Inspection

C. B. Allen, government inspector of levees, is a native of Claiborne County. He came to Rosedale in May, 1893, walking from Gunnison here. As the town was constantly under the threat of overflow, his services have been important to the community, for he was the government man in charge of high water fights from 1893 until his retirement in 1933. He was promoted from inspector to engineer, and in the latter part of his service he was superintendent of construction from the Coahoma to the Warren County line. His last high water fight to protect Rosedale was in 1937, when he was called back for emergency service. He married Frannie Clark, eldest daughter of Fred and Margaret Winchester Clark. They have two children, Margaret, who married Edward H. Green, a prominent lawyer and present Judge of the Circuit Court of this district; and Charles B. Jr., who married Dorothy Reeve. They have four grandchildren, Ed Green, Jr., and Margaret Green, Charles B. III, and Dorothy Ruth Allen."
